but definitely not the last — the dead battery in the truck that housed our portable dance floor, and the two dozen volunteers who saved the day and raced to assemble it in time for Saturday's Hoedown — riveting performances by visiting dance troupes at the Hoedown — drawing the winning RSVP cruise ticket: John Pleskach — the elegant Sunday brunch in the beautiful Ramada ballroom — the largest crowd Sundance Saloon has ever seen at the Stompede Ball on Sunday night — and watching the participants of the Sleazy Shadow contest, all of them winners in our eyes.


