

CROSSING THE BORDER

4-wall line dance

Music: I Got You (Marc Anthony)

| count | step |
|--------|--|
| 1&2 | Step L to the left; shift weight to R; cross L over R |
| 3&4 | Dip shoulders right, left, right |
| 5&6 | Step R to the right; shift weight to L; cross R over L |
| 7&8 | Dip shoulders left, right, left |
| 9&10 | Step L to the left; shift weight to R; cross L over R |
| 11&12 | Step R to the right; shift weight to L; cross R over L |
| 13&14 | Step L to the left; shift weight to R; cross L over R |
| 15, 16 | Step R forward; pivot $\frac{1}{2}$ -turn to the left onto L |
| 17&18 | Shuffle forward R, L, R |
| 19&20 | Shuffle forward L, R, L (pick up heel) |
| 21&22 | Shuffle back R, L, R |
| 23&24 | Shuffle back L, R, L |
| 25, 26 | Rock R back, recover L |
| 27&28 | Shuffle forward R, L, R with ½-turn to the left |
| 29, 30 | Rock L back, recover R |
| 31, 32 | Step L forward, pivot 3/4-turn to the right and step on R |
