#### THE 2006 SUNDANCE STOMPEDE ARRIVES

October is always a great month for country-western dancers in the Bay Area. Enjoy outdoor dancing at the Castro Street Fair, celebrate Halloween, and of course dance your feet off at the Sundance Stompede!

The Sundance Stompede is San Francisco's

country-western dance weekend, Oct. 12–16. We're expecting hundreds of cowboys and cowgirls from all over North America. Experience four nights of spectacular dance parties, over 30 hours of dance workshops with incredible instructors catering to all levels; social events including

a women's social, the infamous after-hours parties, and more! We'll keep you busy from early morning ... to early morning! (You can sleep after the weekend.)

Get a head start on the weekend with Thursday night's **Pre-Stompede Dance** at Sundance Saloon. 550 Barneveld Ave., admission \$5.

Friday night is the kick-off **Welcome Dance**, 8pm–1am, in the gorgeous ballroom of the host hotel, the Ramada Plaza. Dance on a beautiful permanent hardwood floor. Line dance marathon 8-9pm, then open dancing until 1am. 1231 Market St., admission \$15.

Saturday night's **Hoedown 2006**, 8pm–Iam, stays at the host hotel, but expands to multiple rooms. We'll start with dance exhibitions 8–9pm. Then you can wander between general country-western dancing in the ballroom, the special Line Dance room, or the West Coast Swingathon room. Plus silent

auction, raffle, entertainment, and more. 1231 Market St., admission \$20.

Sunday night caps the weekend with the **Stompede Ball** at Sundance Saloon, 5–11pm. Line dance marathon 5–7pm, then open dancing until 11pm,

with a Pat-and-Chris two-step contest, and our infamous Sleazy Shadow contest. 550 Barneveld, admission \$10.

Our line-up of **dance workshops** and instructors is superb. No tedium at these workshops: they'll feel like special events themselves. There's something for everyone, from beginning to advanced levels. At the Ramada Plaza, 1231 Market St. Friday 1-6pm (\$10), Saturday 10am-4pm (\$20) and Sunday 10am-4pm (\$20).

#### DANCE FLOOR ETIQUETTE

Following dance floor etiquette helps everyone to have fun. Basically, just be courteous and respectful of others around you:

**Dance counterclockwise** around the floor. Don't back up, but if you have to for some reason, look behind you first.

Leaders - look where you are going, and be prepared for the unexpected (like the couple in front of you who didn't look before they backed up). Leaders are responsible for protecting their partners. (Remember, it's always the leader's fault.)

Slower dancers should move towards the inside of the dance floor, allowing faster dancers to pass them on the outside. Don't tailgate another couple, but don't dawdle either (and definitely don't stop!). If there's a large space between you and the couple in front, either move to the inside, or speed up to close the gap. Faster dancers should not move faster than they can safely go.

West or East Coast Swing dancers should leave room on the outside of the dance floor for other dancers. And we request you don't do swing dances on the main floor during line dances,

If you bump into someone, smile and apologize. If someone bumps into you, smile and apologize. If you find yourself apologizing all the time, maybe the problem isn't just everybody else. If you find yourself smiling all the time, well, good.

If you are not dancing, don't stand on the dance floor. Stand close to the wall so we don't experience the incredible shrinking dance floor. Also, don't carry drinks onto the dance floor. Report spills immediately.

Finally, there is no excuse for "road rage" on the dance floor. If you see someone breaking the rules, let it go. Maybe he isn't aware of the rules, maybe she's trying her best, but it's unlikely he really is a jerk who simply enjoys getting in your way. We all make mistakes. Getting angry isn't going to solve anything. Smile, and apologize.
