JANUARY IS ETIQUETTE MONTH

As Sundance Saloon becomes more crowded, it is more important than ever to be courteous and respectful of other dancers. In January we will embark on a special campaign to raise awareness of basic dance etiquette. We'll review a couple rules here.

Dancers should look where they are going! Do not dance harder or faster than is safe. We can all expect an occasional mild bump, but if this is a regular feature of your dancing, or if you have even one major collision, think about why this might be happening.

Stay with the flow of traffic. Slower dancers move towards the inside and leave enough room for others to pass. If there is a gap in front of you, there's a good chance that you are obstructing traffic. (On the other hand, if a couple is dawdling in your way, it doesn't help to give dirty looks or to elbow your way through. Be patient until an opening presents itself when you can safely pass.)

3&4 Shuffle right R, L, R

5,6 Rock L in front of R, recover onto R

7&8 Shuffle left L, R, L

9&10 Shuffle R, L, R 45° forward/left while turning ½ left

11, 12 Rock back L, recover onto R

13&14 Shuffle L, R, L 45° forward/left while turning ½ left

15, 16 Step R to side, step L next to R

17, 18 Facing 45° right, kick R forward, kick R to side

19&20 Step R behind L, step L to left, cross R over L

21, 22 Facing 45° left, kick L forward, kick L to side

23&24 Step L behind R, step R to right, cross L over R

25&26 Turn 1/4 right, shuffle forward R, L, R

27, 28 Step forward L, pivot ½ right

29&30 Shuffle forward L, R, L

31 Step forward R with ½-turn left

32 Step back L with ½-turn left
