This April marks a major milestone in the history of country-western dancing in San Francisco: the tenth anniversary of Sundance Saloon.

Sundance Saloon was created to have a place where everyone felt welcome. A brief history:

★ **1999**–The Sundance Association is granted 501c3 nonprofit status

☆ 2000–The Sundance Association joins the International Association of Gay/Lesbian Country-Western Dance Clubs

☆ 2001–The first Sundance Stompede

☆ 2002
–The search is on for a new space as the King St building is slated for demolition

★ 2003–Volunteers build a new dance floor in our new home at the Space 550 club on Barneveld Ave

★ **2004**–Volunteers construct a second transportable dance floor

Sunday Dancing in the Green Room

Line Dance Basics: Sundays in April at Sundance Saloon

Upcoming Country-Western Dance Weekends

There are two upcoming country-western dance weekends you might consider.

The Emerald City Hoedown in Seattle is April 25-27. This is the first country-western dance weekend produced by Rain Country, Seattle's equivalent to The Sundance Association. The Yo Ho Hoedown in Tampa, FL takes place over Memorial Day Weekend: May 23-25. This is a convention of the International Association of Gay/Lesbian Country-Western Dance Clubs (IAGLCWDC), and promises to attract hundreds of dancers from all over the continent. In addition to three nights of big dance events and 26 hours of dance workshops, there is a dance competition and the usual shenanigans associated with IAGLCWDC conventions. What If We Fly

4-wall line dance

Music: "What If We Fly" - Chely Wright

- 1 Slide L left
- 2-3 Drag R next to L (two beats)
- 4-6 Step R, L, R with full turn to the right
- 7-9 Cross L over R, touch R next to L, hold
- 10-12 Step R back, step L next to R, step R forward
- 13-15 Cross L over R, kick R forward, hold
- 16-18 Cross R over L, step L to left, cross R behind L
- 19 Step L to left, with ¼-turn left
- 20-21 Sweep R in a circle until it is next to L (2 beats)
- 22 Step R to right
- 23-24 Sweep L in a circle until it is next to R (2 beats)
- 25 Cross L over R
- 26,27 Step R back, step L back
- 28 Cross R over L
- 29,30 Step L back, step R back with ½-turn to the right
- 31-33 Step L forward, touch R next to L, hold
- 34-36 Step R foot back, touch L to the side, hold
- 37-39 Cross L over right, touch R to the side, hold
- $40\text{-}42^{\ast}\,$ Step R back, step L in place, step R in place,
- 43 Cross left foot over right
- 44-45 Sweep R in a circle and cross over L (2 beats)
- 46 Step weight onto R (crossed over left)
- 47,48 Step L to left, step R behind left
